

Guidelines for the position of LDR Chair

As determined by the LDR Rules & Responsibilities subcommittee

1. The Long Distance Running Committee Chair shall demonstrate a basic understanding of USA Track & Field, its mission and programs.
2. The LDR Chair will attend the USATF Nebraska Association annual meeting. Duties there will be to lead formal business of the program.
3. Persons interested in running for the elected LDR Chair position, must submit a declaration of candidacy with platform presentation to the association's website within 60 days of the Nebraska Association annual meeting, typically held the third Sunday each September. Elections are typically held on even numbered years. The LDR Chair will work with the association's website to offer on line balloting.
4. The LDR Chair will oversee the LDR Championships Program. A Championships subcommittee, consisting of one member from each USATF LDR member club will review and recommend to the LDR Chair the slate of approved events.
5. The LDR Chair will oversee existing programs and develop initiatives to create opportunities in all of the LDR disciplines including cross country, roads, mountain, ultra, and trail. The LDR Chair will continue development of the Masters Program. The LDR Chair will name subcommittee chairs for Men's LDR, Women's LDR, XC, MUT, and Masters disciplines.
6. The LDR Chair will schedule at least one committee meeting outside of the Nebraska Association meeting held in September. The meeting date, location, and time will be provided to the Nebraska Association website 30 days prior to the meeting.
7. The LDR Chair Committee will provide a biannual report to the membership via the association's website.
8. The LDR Chair will be subject to recall by a 2/3 majority of those present at association annual meeting or LDR committee meeting.
